## Morning Traffic & Guidelines

**NO DOGS ALLOWED** on campus during drop off or pick up. There are students that are fearful of dogs so it is important that we follow the Parent Student Handbook and do not bring dogs onto school property at those times!

Traffic has been pretty smooth so far, so we thank you for that!! A couple of things to keep in mind regarding arrival:

- Please make sure to use a **turn signal**. This helps traffic guards be better equipped when students are looking to cross.

- Please be patient! The #1 goal is to get the students into school safe.
- Please do not get out of your car when using Kiss & Go drop off.
- If you want to walk your child to their door, you must park off the campus block. Campus block is meant for a one-way clockwise flow of traffic.
- Parents will not be able to enter the building at their child's door. This is safety matter. Any parents have to walk around to Door #1 and check in with Ms. Maria.
